

Lupus is a chronic autoimmune disease that most often affects women and can cause inflammation and pain throughout the body. Lupus has a physical, emotional, and economic impact. The Social Security Administration lists lupus in its Blue Book, therefore it may qualify as a disability when it meets specific conditions (disability-benefits-help.org).

Statistically, 1.5 million people in the United States have lupus (Very Well Health) and women are 9 to 10 times more likely than men to develop lupus (hopkinsmedicine.org)
