Disability Rights Legislative Day

"We Are Here" was the theme for Disability Rights Legislative Day at the Missouri State Capitol on March 13th. If you happened to be there, this became loud and clear during the rally in the people's house. It was wonderful to be a part of a community of people with disabilities, employees, and other constituents who gathered together to make sure their voices were heard and speak directly to Legislators. UCP Heartland was proud to take a group of 61 people, led by Duane Gruis, UCP Heartland's Client Advocate/Service Navigator. As you see in the pictures, we all had t-shirts with the saying "Advocate with Passion," and this group did just that, as they participated and had great conversations with different Senators and Representatives.

In partnership with Starling, the priority message was to 1. ensure people with Intellectual and Developmental Disabilities receive essential services to live and work in their communities by appropriating sufficient funding for these services. 2. Strengthen employment services for individuals with disabilities to join Missouri's workforce by supporting Employment First initiatives and funding community employment services. 3. No changes to Missouri's property tax structure because they play a vital role in funding community services for people with intellectual and developmental disabilities.
