We envision being the provider of choice for children and adults with differing abilities and making sure all people have the opportunity to live, learn, engage, work, and reach their full potential.



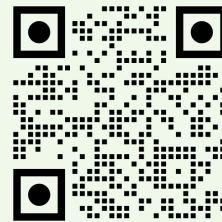

Our Mission

At UCP Heartland, our mission is to provide children and adults living with differing abilities extraordinary care and support they need to thrive in school, at home, at work, and in the community.

UCP Heartland was established in 1953 by a group of concerned parents. For seven decades and beyond, we have been the beacon of hope, breaking barriers and fostering a sense of belonging for every individual. We are a 501 (c)3 non-profit dedicated to advancing the productivity and independence of people living with a spectrum of differing abilities including Autism, Down Syndrome, Cerebral Palsy, traumatic brain injuries, and other developmental disabilities.



Independent Supported Living (ISL)

Provides 24-hour individualized support to clients living in their own home throughout the St. Louis area. Our teams provide support with all areas of independent living including personal care, cooking, medication, arranging transportation, coordinating medical care, community outings and social activities. Consumers live with 1 to 3 roommates.

Pre-Independent Supported Living Assistance

Provides time-limited (2-year) support to individuals who currently reside in their natural home, to build skills needed to transition to live independently. UCPH can provide up to 50 hours a month or 600 hours annually.

Independent Supportive Living Assistance (ISLA)

ISLA provides up to 10 hours per week of staff support to people with varying abilities who are living in their own homes. Residents learn new skills in 10 primary areas: medical care, shopping, laundry, housework, safety, finance, transportation, jobs, socialization, and cooking.



Program Goal

Provide the opportunity for people living with developmental disabilities to live with a roommate, in their own home, or in an apartment of their choice.

UCP Heartland strives to assist each individual with achieving their greatest level of self-sufficiency.
